VAGO School Costs Report proves an Education Ombudsman for all sectors is needed

Our Children Our Schools (OCOS) welcomes today's release of the Victorian Auditor-General's Report "Additional School Costs for Families" and calls on the government to give Victorians an education ombudsman.

The report highlights once again the importance to the Victorian community to be able to trust the performance and accountability of the Victorian public service.

The fact that school costs are rising is not news to Victorian parents. However, the public can for the first time appreciate just how much more schools and the Department of Education and Training (DET) could do to help make government schools more affordable.

OCOS spokesperson, Catherine Hall said, 'Our Children, Our Schools supports every measure to ease the burden of school costs on families, especially for low-income families'.

To name one example, DET has a policy of one student: one computer and this is essentially a parent funded policy without any duty of care or effort to appreciate its effect on student participation or family budgets.

The report points to so many weaknesses in the administration and knowledge of current school costs and funding regimes that OCOS thinks only a dedicated Education Ombudsman could systemically tackle this issue and scrutinise the delivery of educational services across the school sectors.

All schools receive public monies so it is only fair all schools are subject to regular accountability mechanisms.

OCOS calls on all families and all other education stakeholders to start talking about increasing scrutiny in educational delivery beyond school council governance and DET procedures and policies.

Last year's election campaigns witnessed many new school announcements showing that local activism is needed to compensate for the lack of planned long-term provision of state schools.

'Let's make Victoria the Education State and start by giving it an Education Ombudsman', said Hall.
